





FAFSA Completion Initiatives – Community

- Course to College Network
 - Statewide network of school counselors dedicated to increasing the collegegoing culture in their schools
 - We provide: weekly network calls, resources & tools, incentives, & assistance with events
 - We encourage each partner school to set FAFSA goal
- FAFSA Certification training provided by Iowa College Access Network(ICAN)
 - Provide FAFSA training to all partner schools
- Texting
 - Offer 1:1 texting to counselors with college info, deadlines, changes, reminders & ability to ask questions



Tailgating events will be held around the state to promote and assist in FAFSA completion.


