# About the microcredential

- Nine weeks, 45 hours
- Created in cooperation with Creative Commons
- Copyright and CC content, spanning four weeks, was heavily adapted from CC Certificate content and reviewed by Creative Commons
- Other content includes the ecosystem of academic and scholarly publishing, OER and OA, advocacy, stakeholders and funding, student success, accessibility, assessing peer programs, and goal-setting

# Coursework

- Course is run through Canvas with a combination of text, video, and audio
- Coursework consists of discussions, quizzes, real-world program assessments and creation of a mock or real-world initiative plan with measurable goals
- Professional instructional design team worked to adapt content to an online format
