What does a college degree provide and is it worth the investment?

- College sticker prices continue to climb
- Students and parents want evidence that the time and expense of college will provide good returns
- States worry about investing in students who might leave
- Increasing pressure on colleges to report outcomes data (e.g., Iowa House File 135)

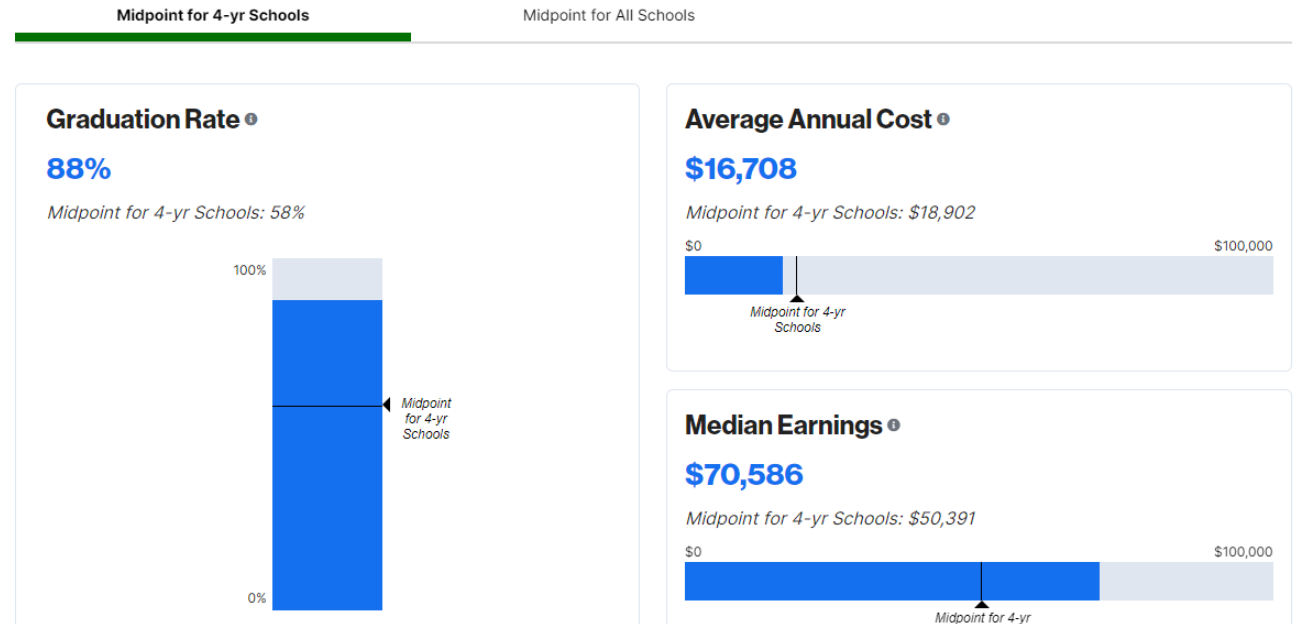
Existing option: Matching college graduates to state workforce data

- Unemployment Insurance (UI) wage data
- Does not include self-employed, stay at home parents, federal employees
- Industry but not occupation
- In-state only (wages and location)
- SSN required
- Lose control of data

Existing Option: U.S. Dept of Ed's College Scorecard

- IRS wage data
- Wages 1 year after graduation (added years 2, 3, 4 recently)
- Only for recipients of Title IV Federal financial aid (54.5%)
- Includes debt of graduates
- Data reported by colleges directly to the U.S. Department of Education
- Does not track graduate location
- Top down approach

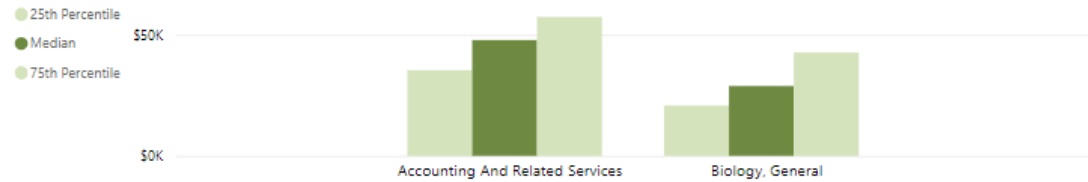

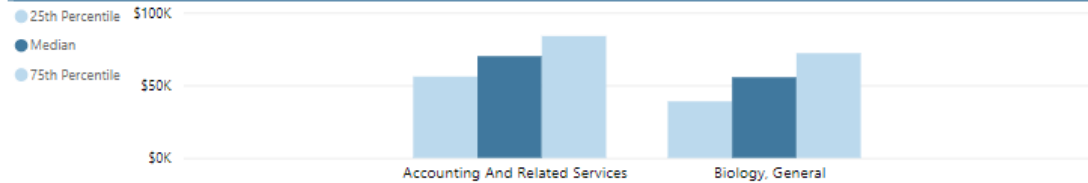

5th-Year Earnings

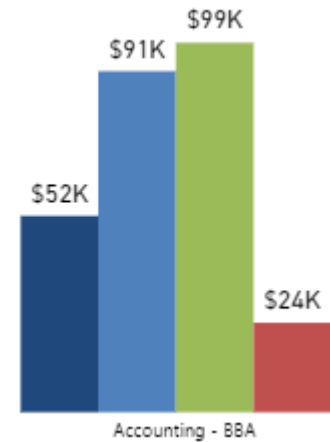


10th-Year Earnings

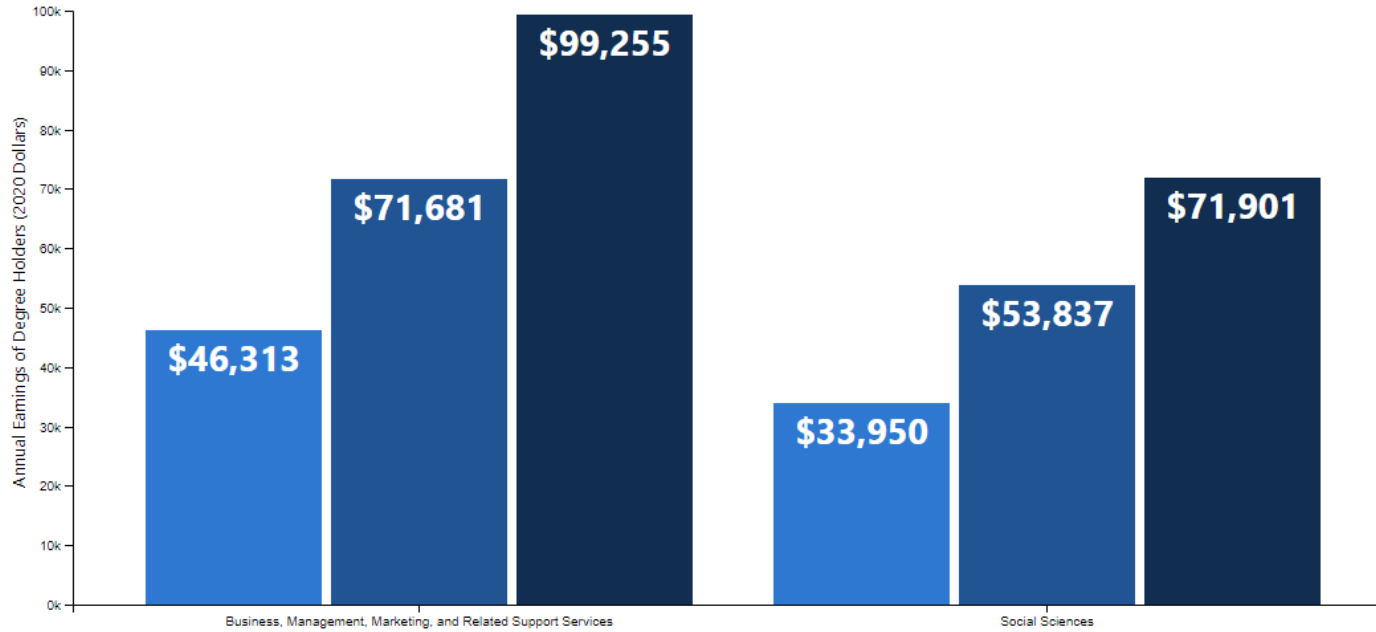

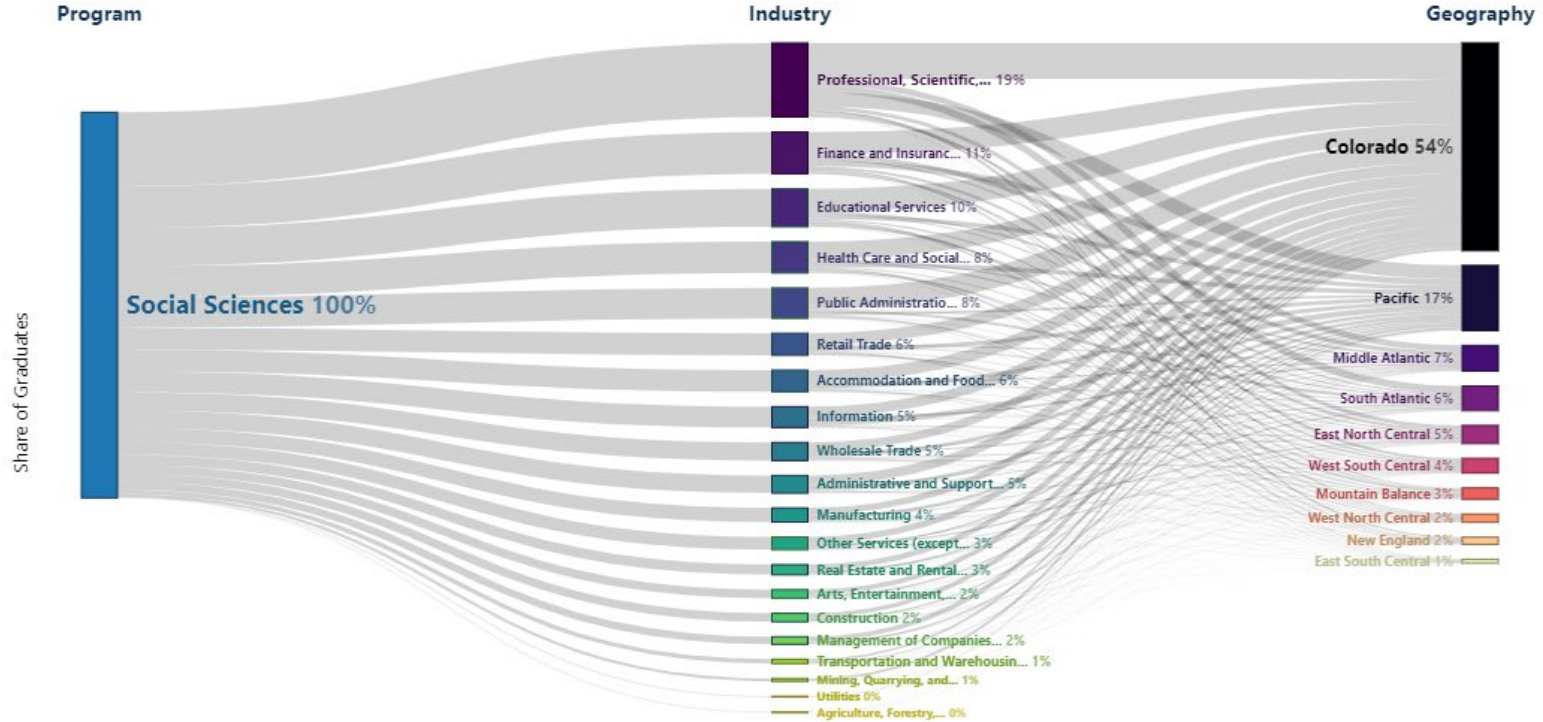

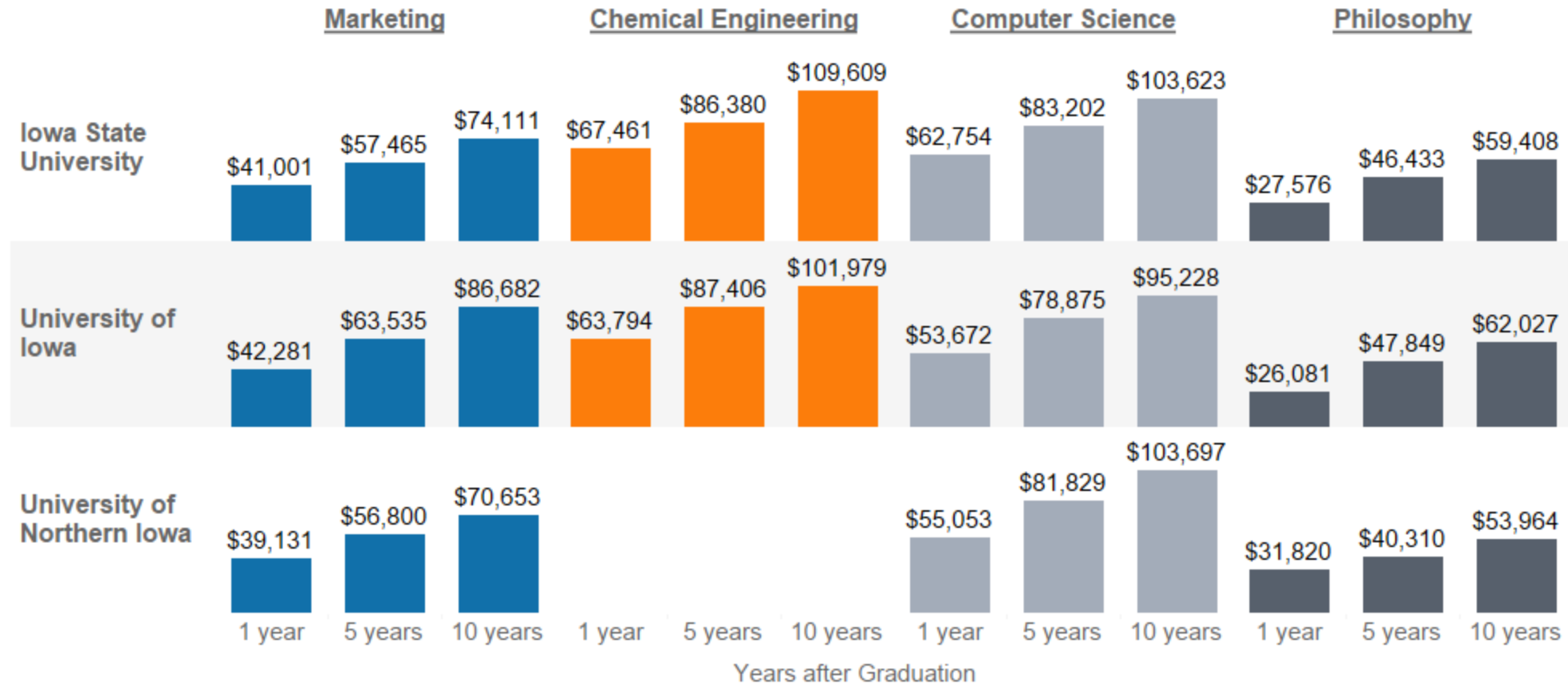

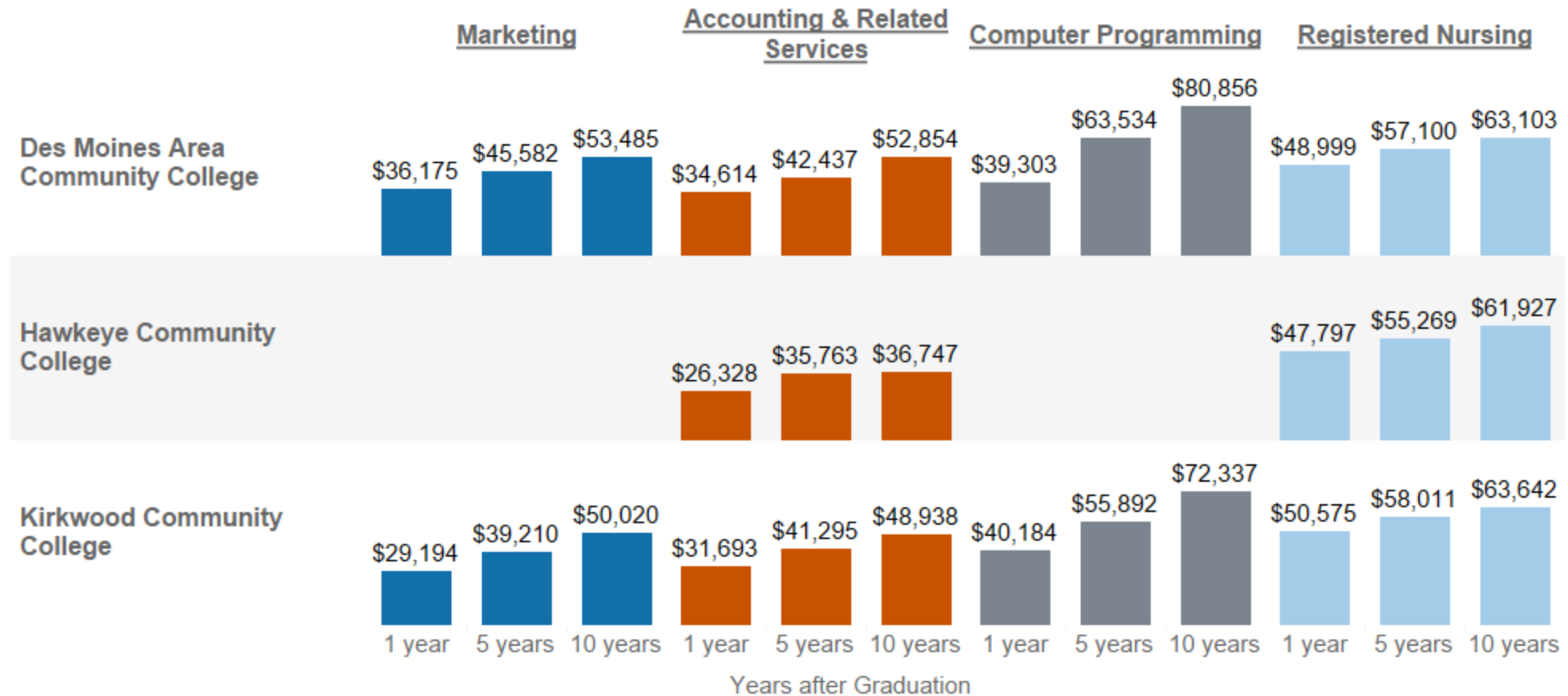

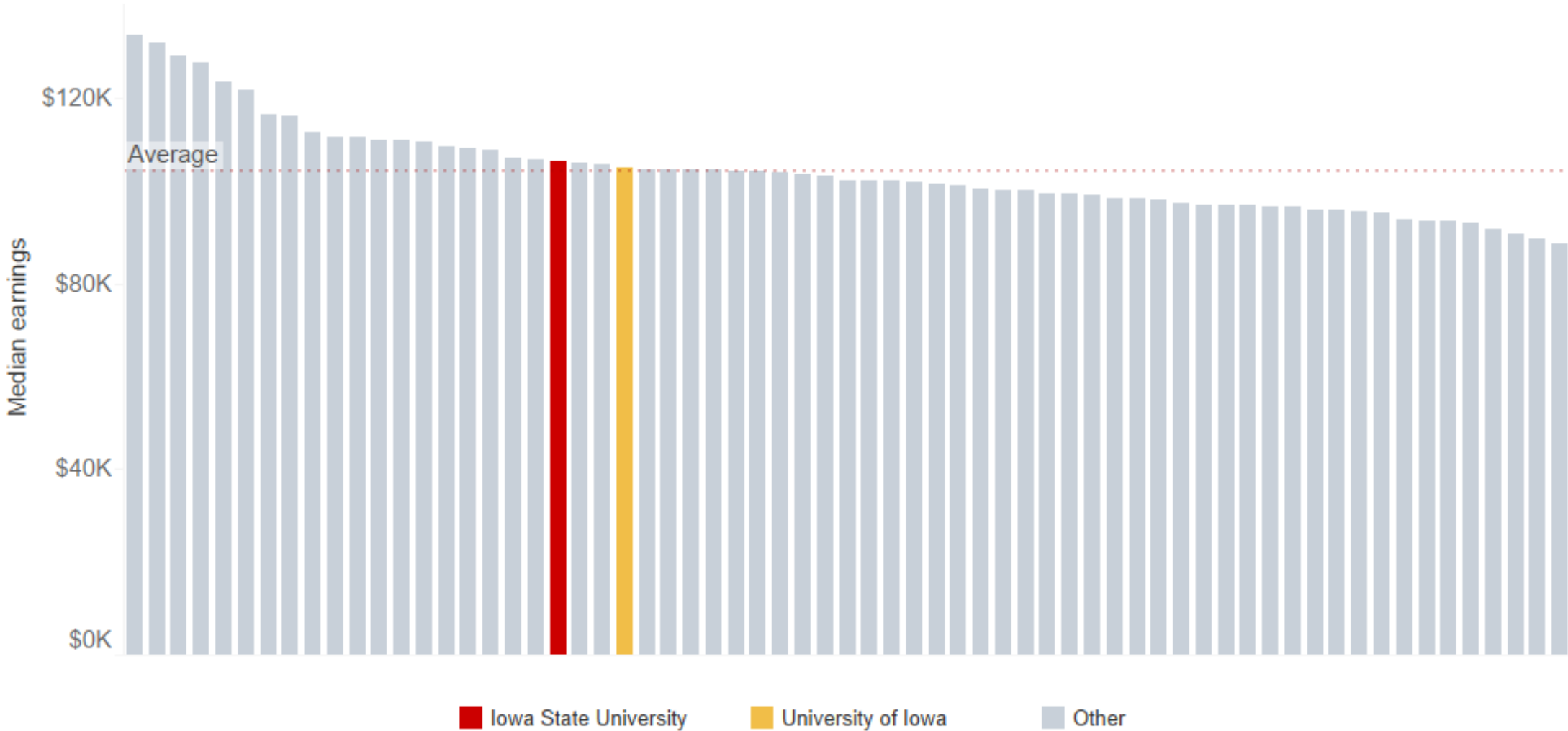
Iowa Graduates with **Associate Degrees** have Good Jobs with Good Wages by Major

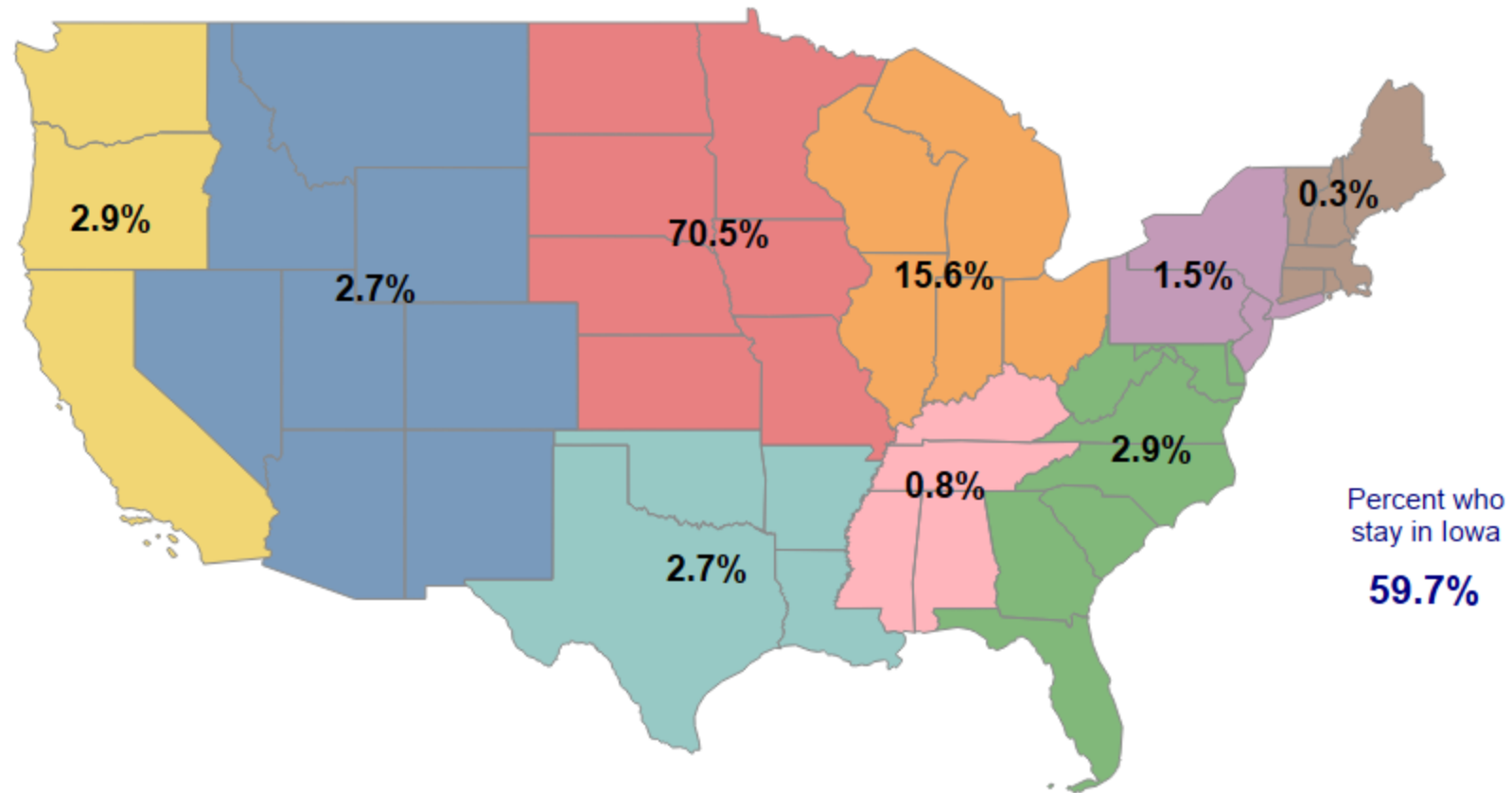

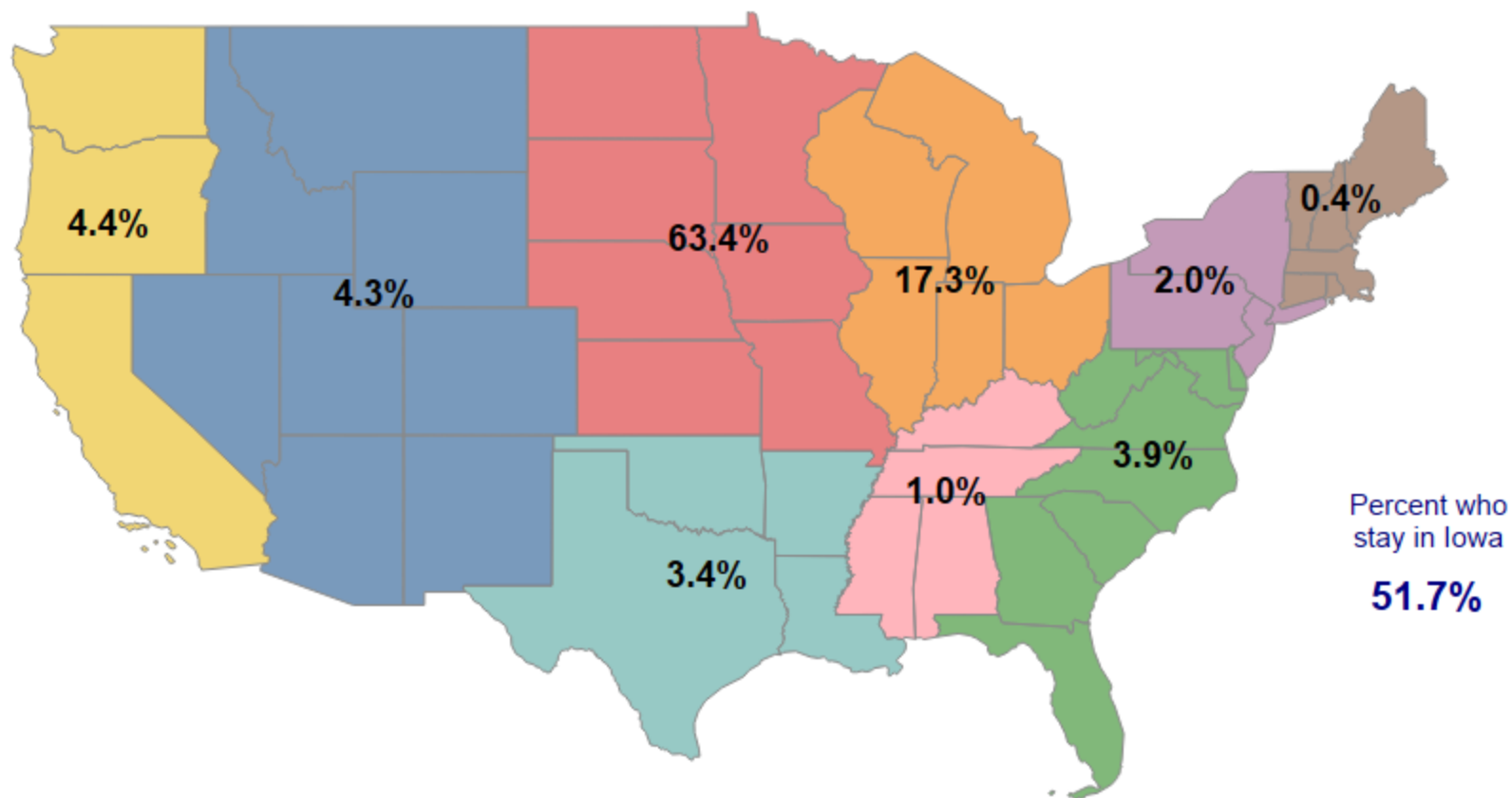

Where do Iowa **Baccalaureate Degree** Recipients Work One Year after Graduation?



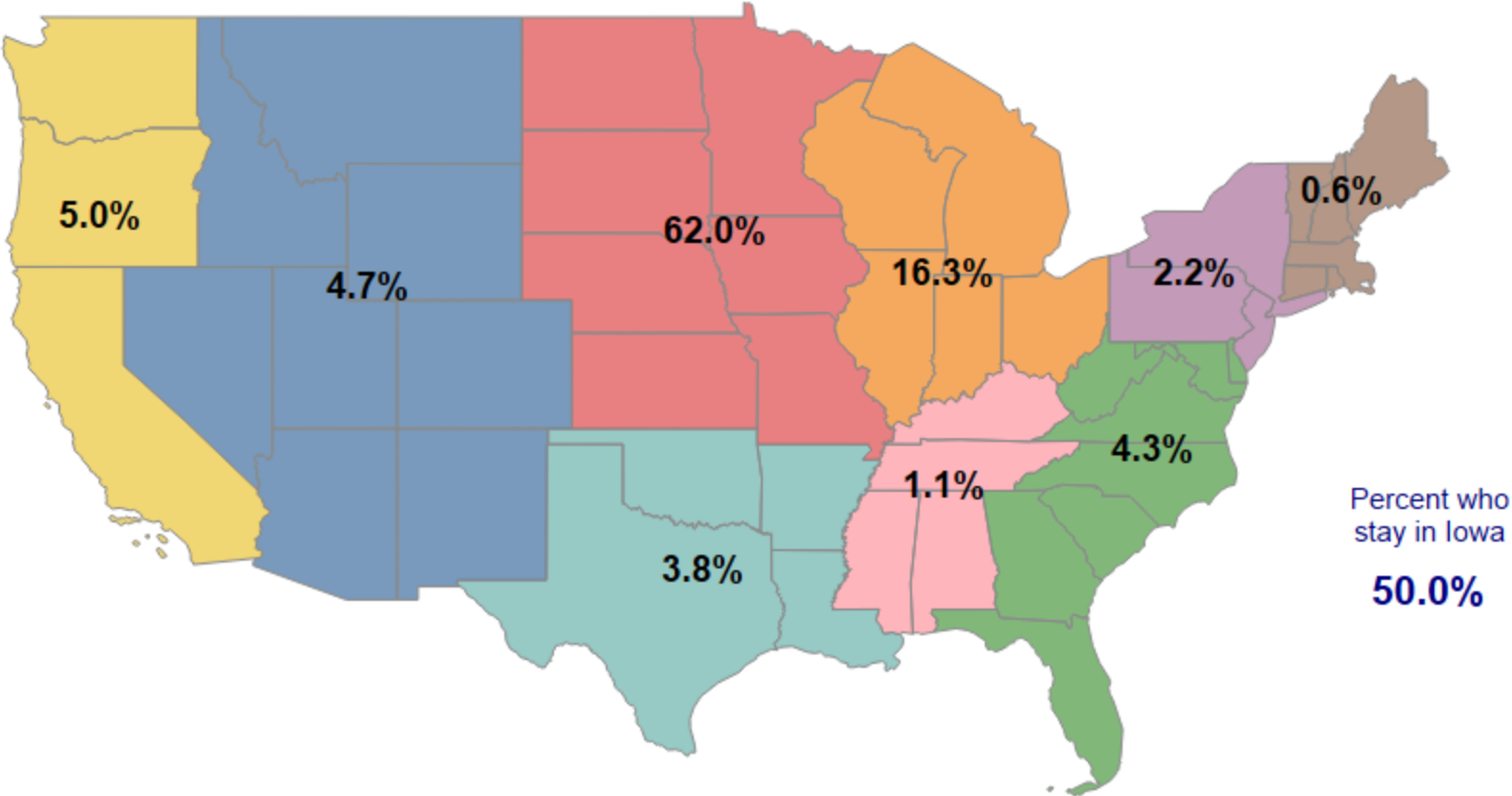

Where do Iowa Baccalaureate Degree Recipients Work 5 Years after Graduation?



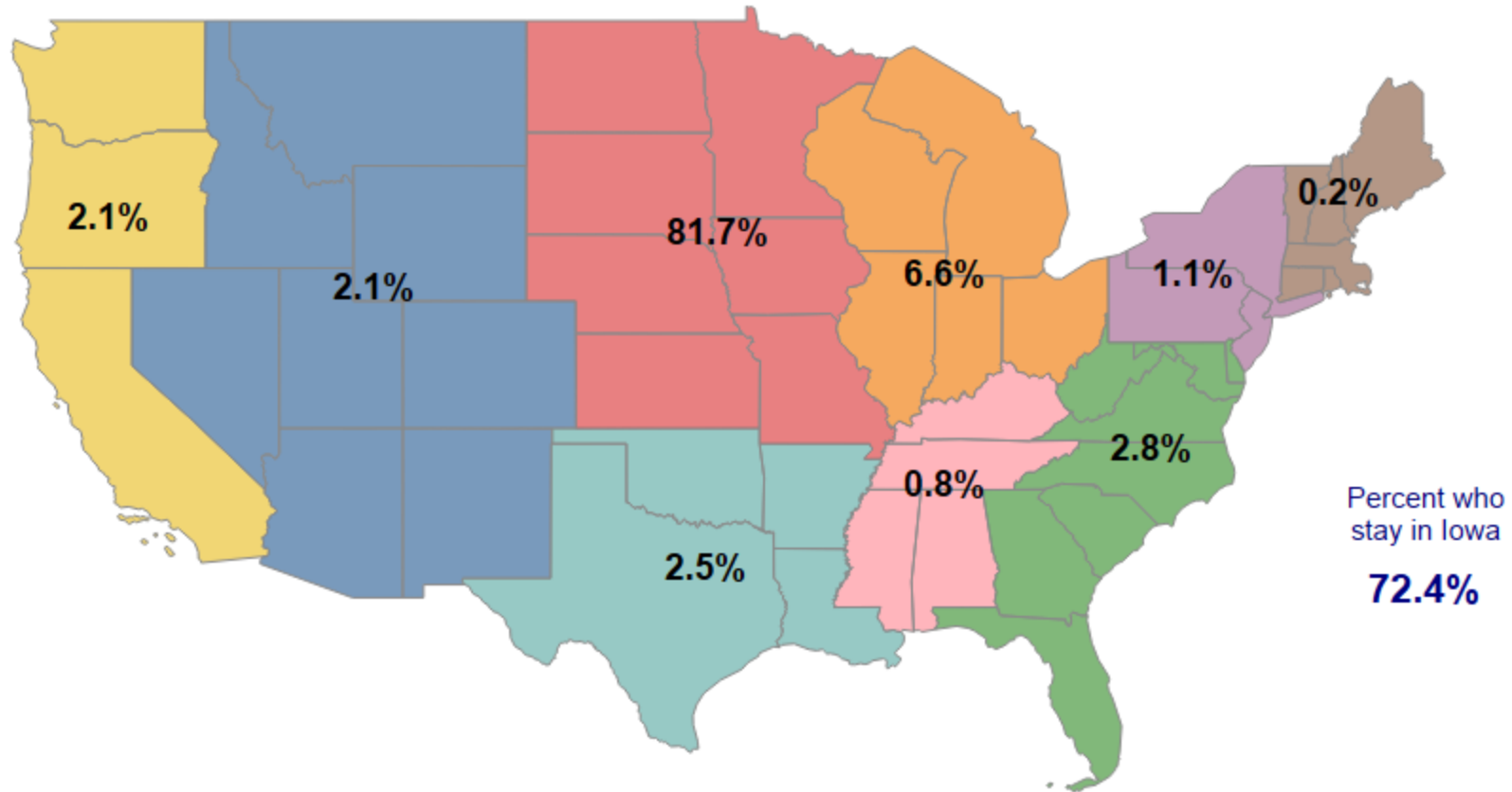

Where do Iowa Baccalaureate Degree Recipients Work 10 Years after Graduation?



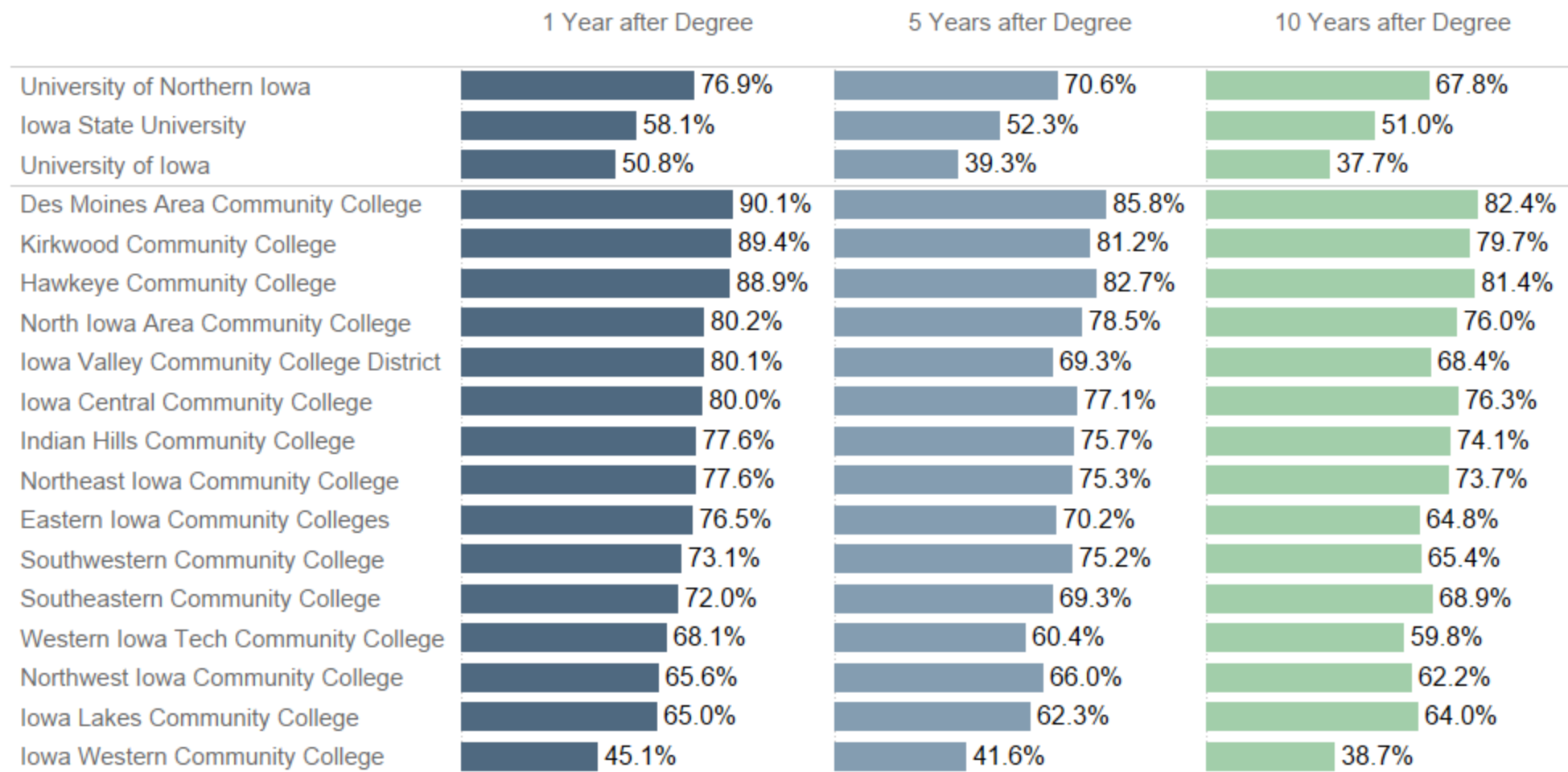

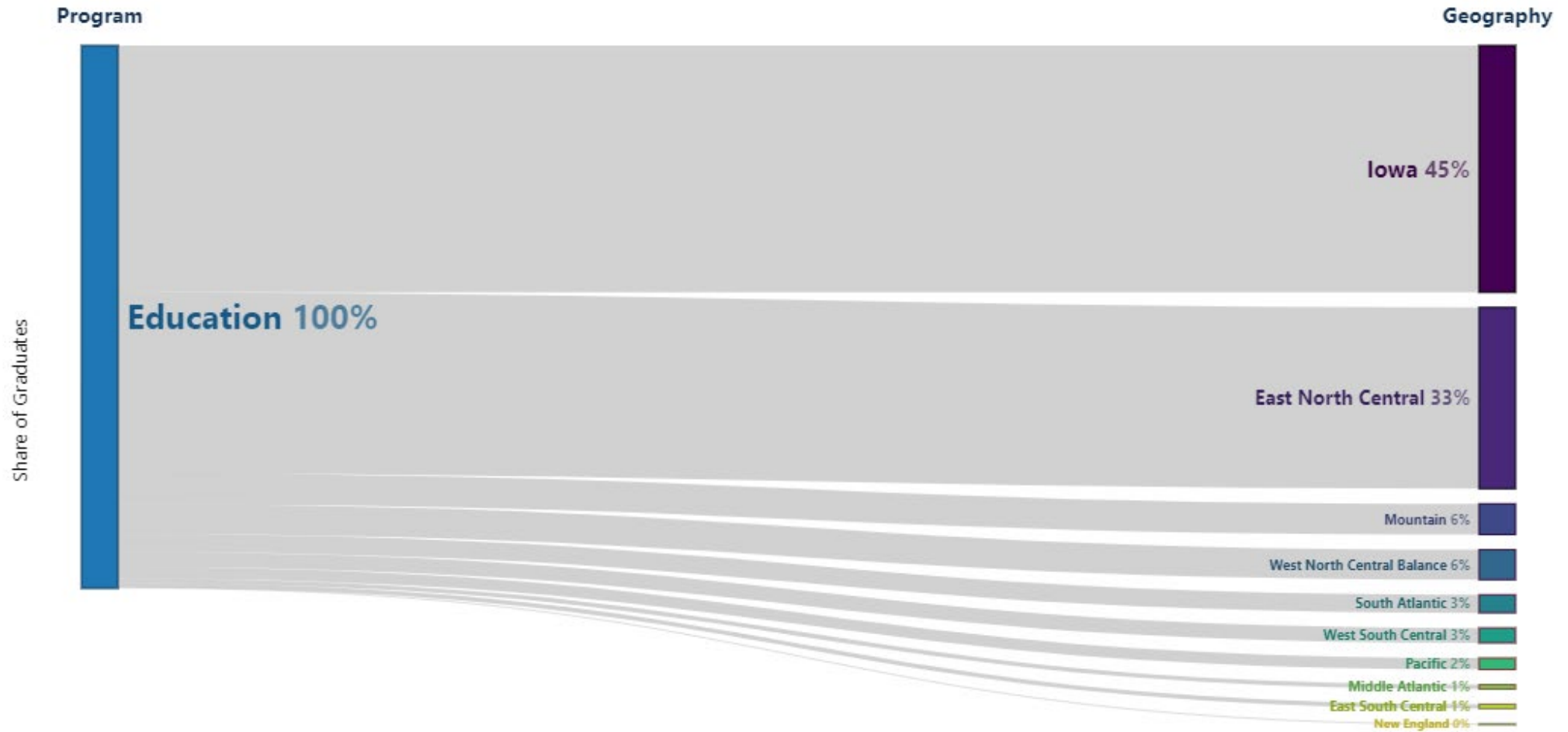
Percent of Iowa Degree Recipients Employed Full-Time in Iowa

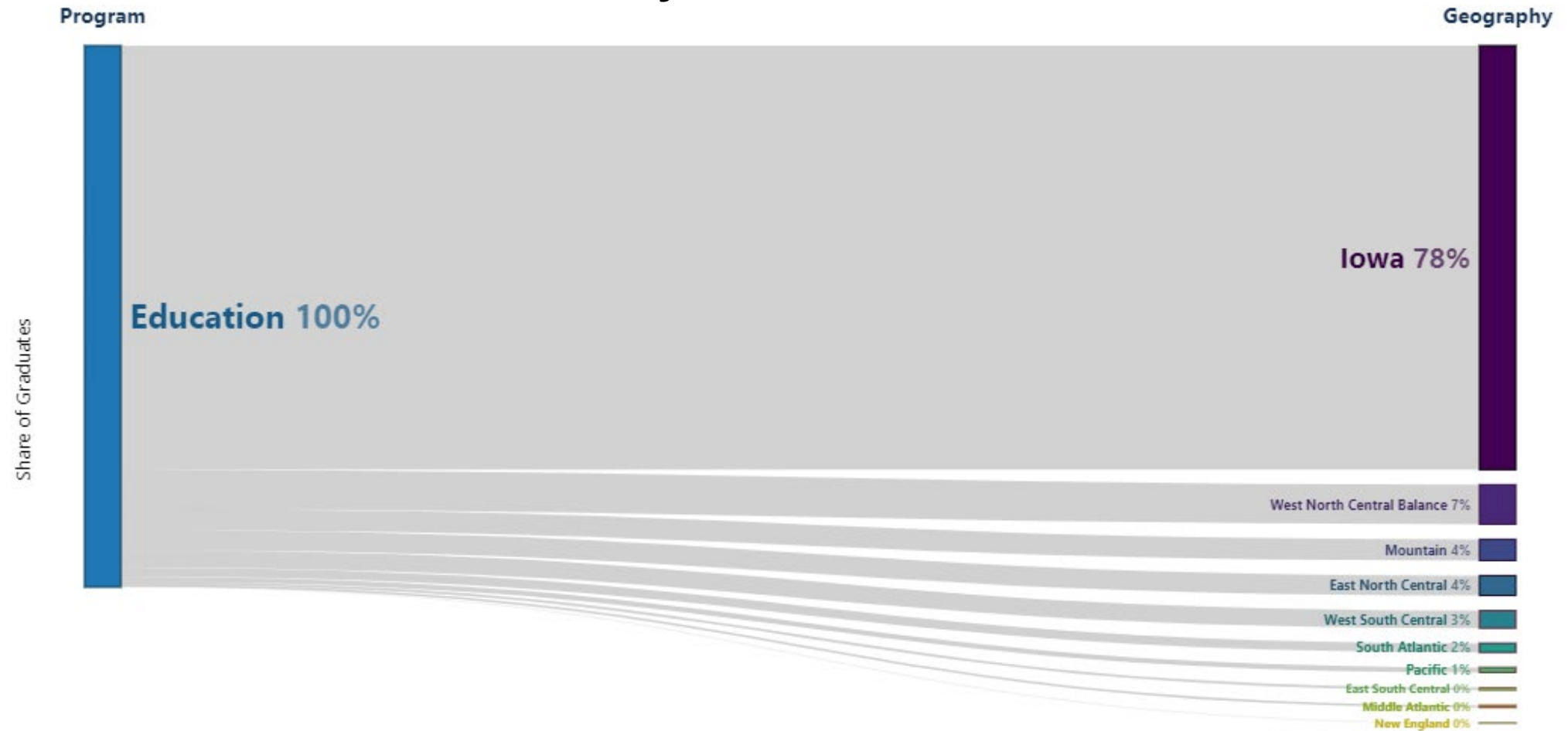
Where are Bachelor's degrees in Education employed 5 years after graduation?

University of Iowa



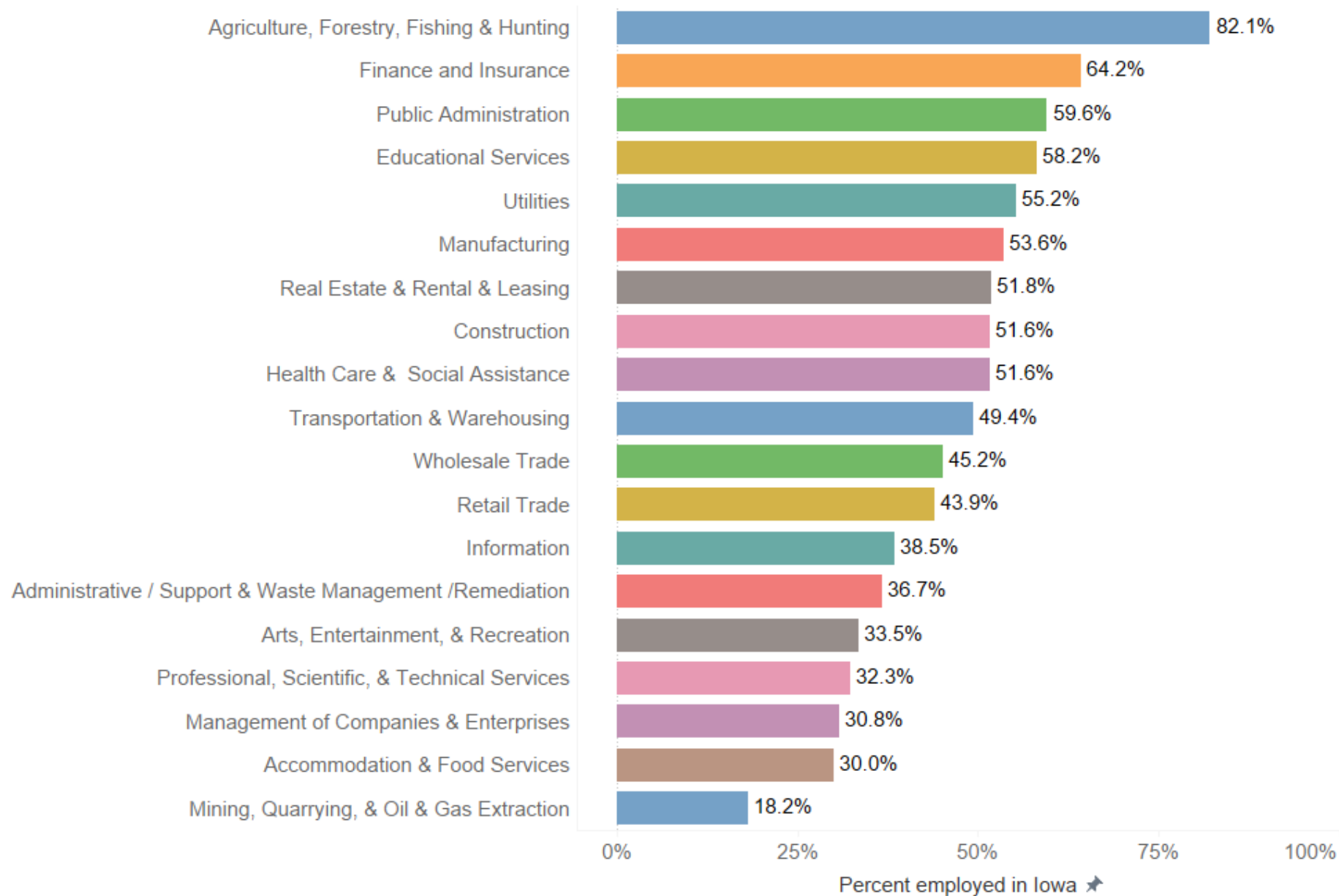
Where are Bachelor's degrees in Education employed 5 years after graduation?

Census PSEO Recap

- Rapidly expanding grassroots effort
- Shows graduate wages, industry, and job location over time
- Shows the percent employed in state
- Working to create dedicated funding (Strada, Federal funding)
- Shows good wages for graduates
- Relatively little difference in wages between colleges
- Data instead of anecdotes
