







National Trend in the Number of High School Graduates








Why is the college-going rate of high school graduates dropping?

Percent and Number of Iowa Public HS Graduates Enrolled in College Within One Year of HS Graduation









by Race/Ethnicity, Gender, and Free or Reduced-Price Lunch Eligibility






College Destination by State for 2022-2023 lowa HS Graduates





Iowa High School Graduates Attending a 4-Year Public University in Another State







(2009-10 to 2024-25 Entry Cohorts)













Percent of Undergraduates Who Graduate Within Three Years By Regent University



Median Earnings 10-years after Degree




Iowa Industry Retention of Regent Graduates after 10 years






