ABOUT THE MSEP

INTRODUCTION

The Midwestern Higher Education Compact (MHEC) helps improve access to postsecondary education through the Midwest Student Exchange Program (MSEP). Since 1994, the MSEP has provided more affordable opportunities for students to attend out-ofstate institutions. The MSEP serves as the Midwest's largest multi-state tuition reciprocity program. Over 60 colleges and universities in Indiana, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, and Wisconsin have opened their doors to each other's citizens at more affordable rates for undergraduates and some graduate students. Although the MHEC is composed of 12 Midwestern states, the MSEP is a voluntary program (as are all MHEC programs) with Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, and South Dakota electing not to participate in the 2025 fiscal year.

This report shares data on the impact of MSEP on students and institutions, including student cost savings, enrollment by institution and by state, and degree program participation.

In recent years, however, MSEP participation has declined significantly, both in overall student numbers and in the total tuition savings realized across the region. While MHEC remains committed to advancing affordable interstate higher education options, this downward trend raises important questions about whether the current program model continues to serve states' evolving needs. As part of its mission to respond to shifting postsecondary landscapes and student

mobility patterns, MHEC will assess whether the MSEP structure still delivers value. If it no longer aligns with member states' strategic goals or enrollment realities, MHEC is prepared to reimagine the program to better advance affordability and opportunity across the region.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

MHEC makes it easy for counselors, parents and students to find information about institutions participating in the MSEP by using the online search tool at msep.mhec.org.

Through the program, public institutions agree to charge students no more than 150% of the in-state resident tuition rate and private institutions offer a 10% reduction on their tuition rates. Institutions may limit the MSEP to specific programs or degree levels. Students must enroll as a non-resident student at a participating MSEP campus to receive the discount. Actual savings through the program will vary from institution to institution depending upon the tuition rates.





MSEP ENROLLMENT STATUS







MSEP STUDENT TUITION SAVINGS BY HOME STATE OF RESIDENCE*




MSEP STUDENT TUITION SAVINGS BY YEAR*
























