MHEC leverages the knowledge and expertise of postsecondary leaders to generate collaborative solutions to challenges in higher education.

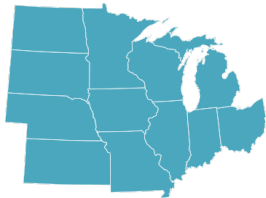


MHEC's contracts and programs save colleges, universities, and students in its member states valuable time and millions of dollars annually.

About the Compact



MHEC was established in the early 1990s through the enactment of legislation recommended by the Midwestern Legislative Conference of The Council of State Governments. MHEC is funded by member state commitments, program income, and foundation grants. Member states are Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin. Missouri enacted authorizing legislation in 1990 to join MHEC.

How MHEC Benefits Missouri

Missouri received a 128-fold return on its MHEC membership commitment of \$115,000 in 2024-2025.

New Upcoming Savings & Financial Opportunities

Each member state is eligible for a Strategic Impact and Innovation Grant of up to \$250,000 over two years from MHEC to advance innovative ideas and solutions in higher education.

Additional Savings for Missouri Students & Families

The Midwest Student Exchange Program (MSEP) has helped students and families save millions of dollars by making it more affordable for non-resident students to attend out-of-state colleges and universities. This program is currently being reviewed in response to changes in tuition reciprocity practices across the region.



Missouri Engagement with MHEC Policy Initiatives & Capacity-Building Opportunities

Open Educational Resources (OER)	MHEC provided a \$10,000 grant for MOBIUS OER Commons Hub for OER workshop stipends and certification support to expand in-state OER experts and build a pipeline for future leadership in the Missouri OER landscape.
Dual Enrollment	Seven Missouri higher education leaders participated in MHEC's July State Policy Workshop to advance dual enrollment efforts in the state. MHEC works to share best practices and convene leaders on this topic.
Access & Affordability	Leaders from numerous Missouri state agencies, colleges and universities, philanthropy, and more attended MHEC's FAFSA Summit and other webinars to address issues and opportunities related to college access and affordability.
Technologies Community	Albert Stadler from Crowder College serves on the Technologies Executive Committee. Four additional technology leaders at Missouri postsecondary institutions participated in MHEC's Technologies Community.

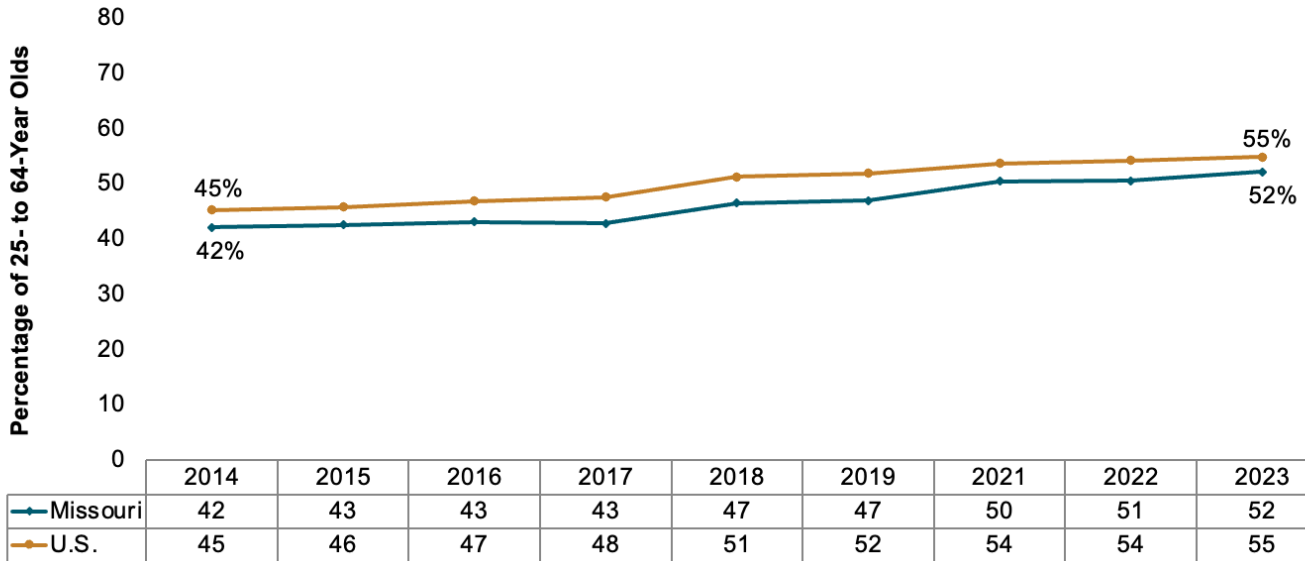

Key Indicators for Higher Education in Missouri

ATTAINMENT: Missouri’s postsecondary attainment rate has increased over the past decade. About 52% of Missourians have a postsecondary certificate or higher, compared to 55% nationally.

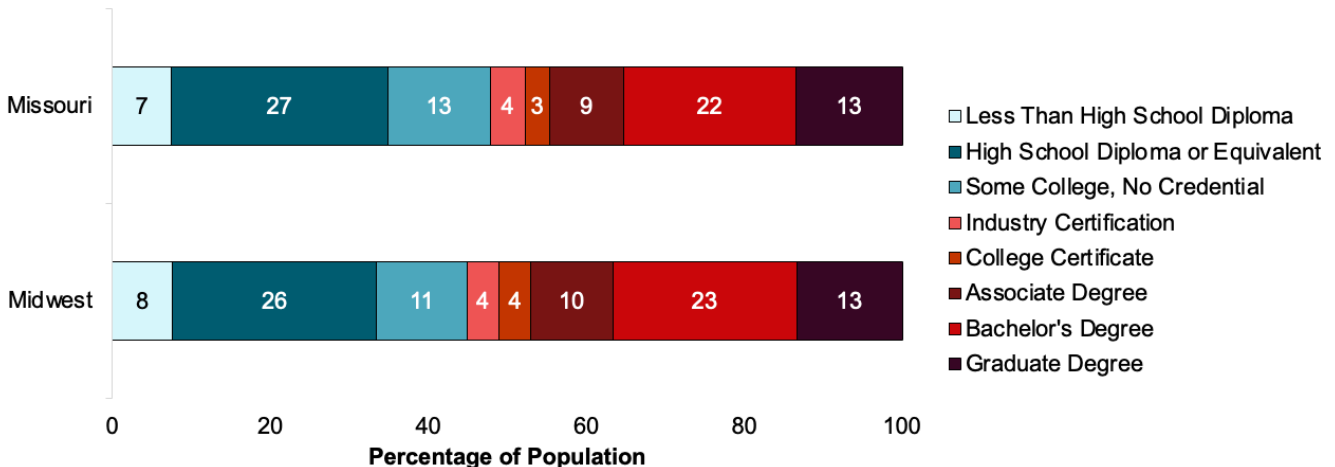
Percentage of 25- to 64-Year-Olds in Missouri Who Have Attained a Postsecondary Credential

ATTAINMENT: Missouri residents have attained various types of postsecondary credentials, ranging from industry certifications and college certificates to bachelor’s and graduate degrees; 48% of residents do not have a credential beyond high school.

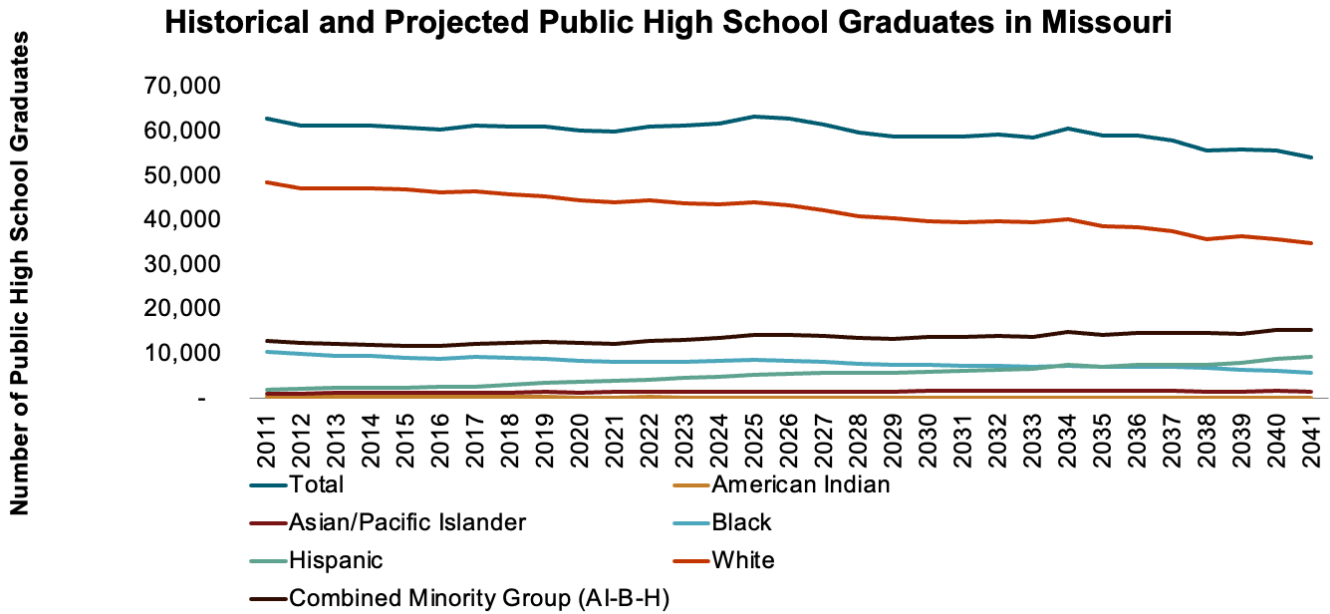
Educational Attainment Distribution of Missouri Residents Ages 25-64, 2023

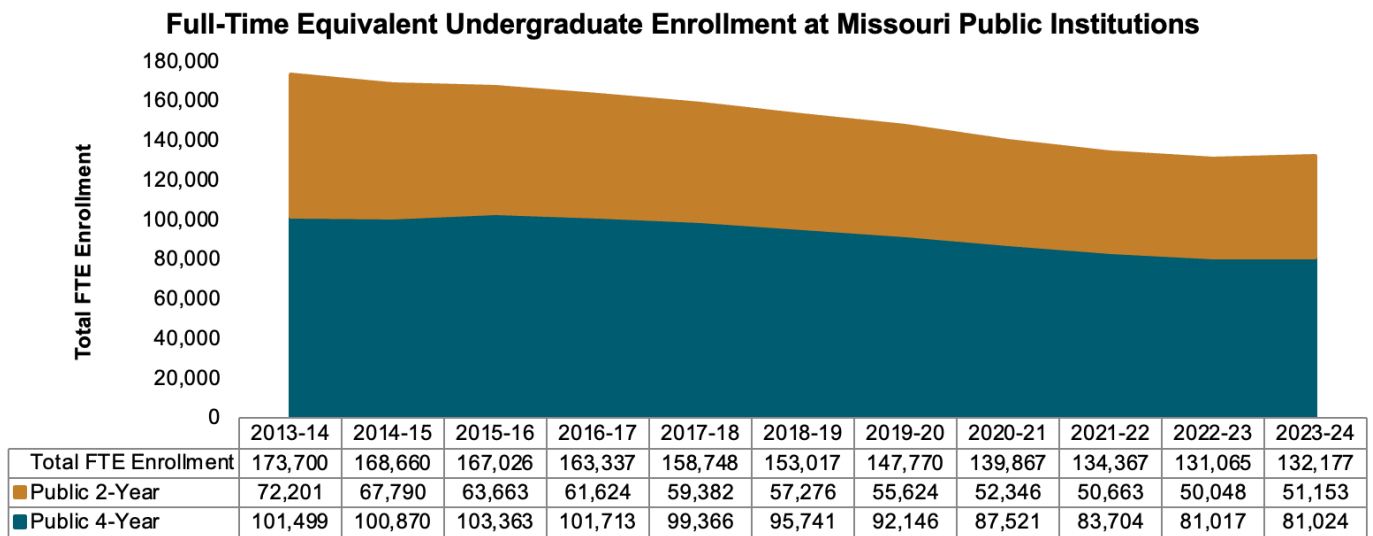


ENROLLMENT POOL: High school graduates are projected to decrease in Missouri over the coming decade, driven by a decrease among White graduates, while the number of graduates in the combined minority group is expected to remain stable.

ENROLLMENT: Undergraduate enrollment has declined at public two- and four-year colleges over much of the past decade but started to increase in 2023-24.

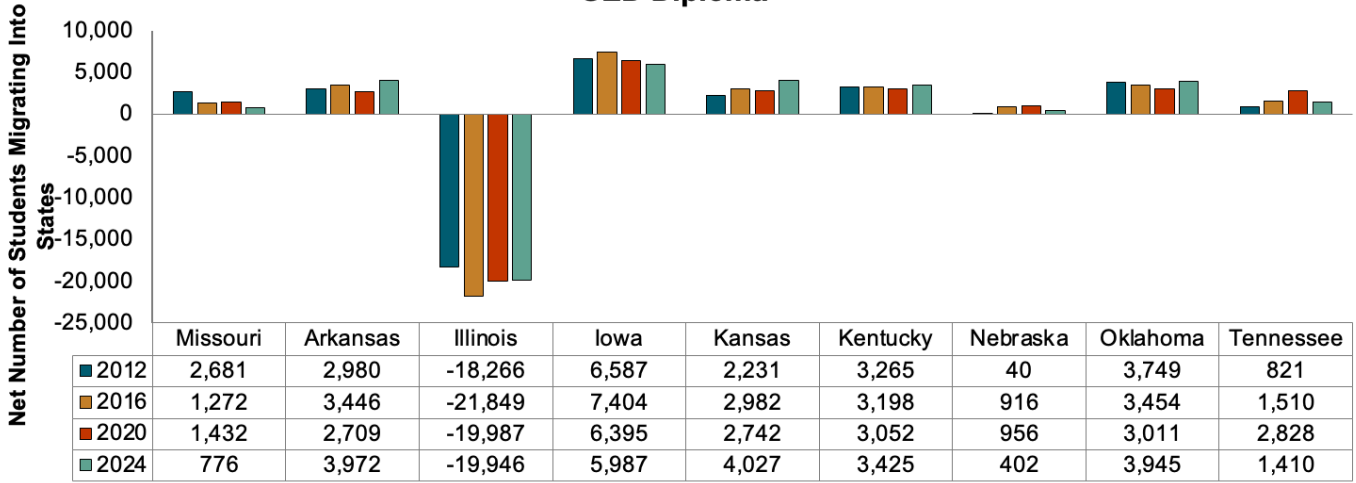

MIGRATION: More students migrate into Missouri than migrate out.

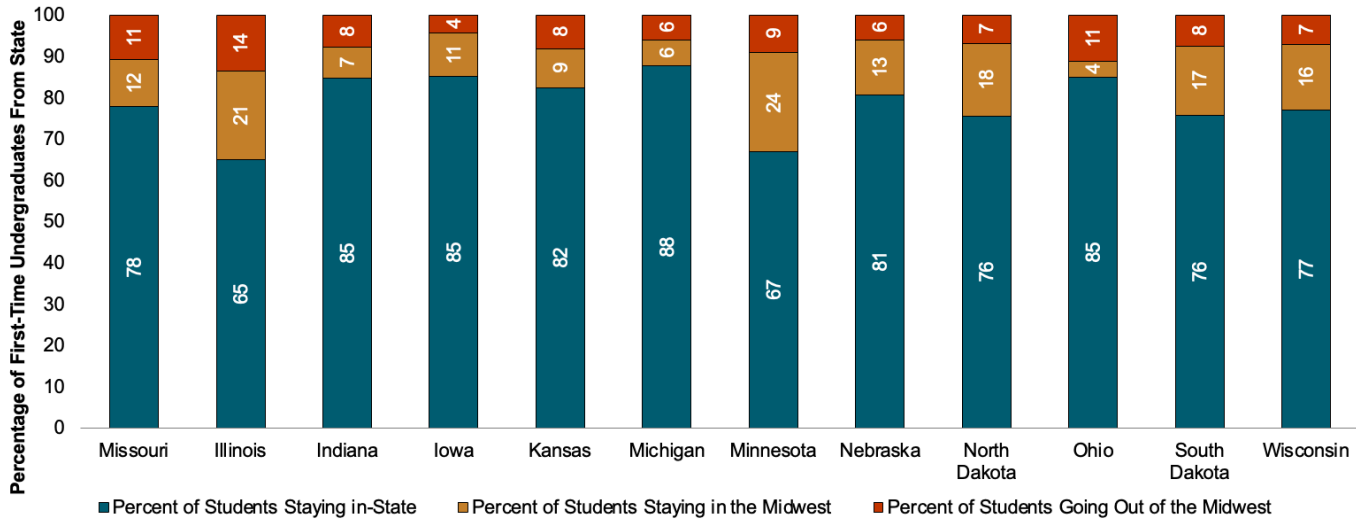
Net In-Migration of High School Graduates Who Enrolled in a Postsecondary Institution Within 12 Months of Graduating From High School or Receiving a GED Diploma

ENROLLMENT LOCATION: Of first-time college students from Missouri, 78 percent enrolled in state, 12 percent enrolled elsewhere in the Midwest, and 11 percent enrolled outside the Midwest.

Regional Migration of High School Graduates Who Enrolled in a Postsecondary Institution In Fall 2024 Immediately Following High School Completion

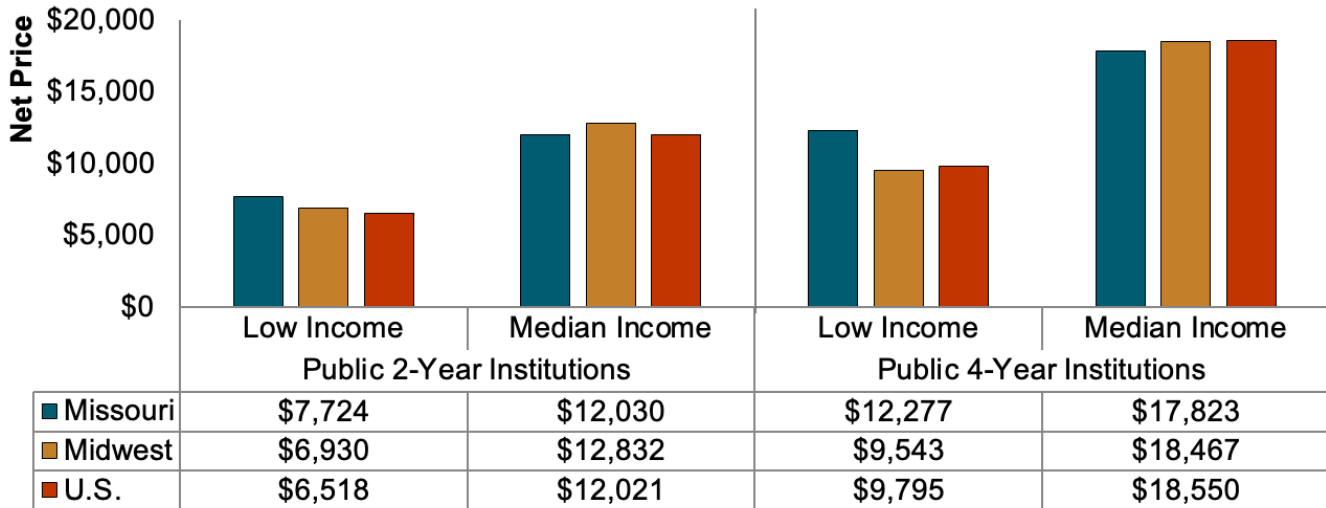

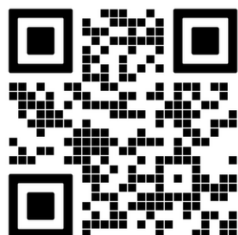
